Yes, the CARES Act requires all clinical laboratories and testing providers that perform diagnostic testing under a Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) certificate to report the results of any test that is intended to detect SARS-CoV-2 or to diagnose a possible case of COVID-19 (e.g., molecular, antigen, antibody), not just ...

The "laboratory testing cycle" consists of all steps between the time when a clinician thinks about and orders a laboratory test and the time the appropriate patient's sample for testing is obtained (eg, a blood specimen taken from an antecubital vein) and the results of the testing are returned to the clinician (often called the "vein-to-brain" turnaround time [TAT] of test results).

Clinical chemistry is the branch of laboratory medicine that focuses primarily on molecules. The tests in a clinical chemistry laboratory measure concentrations of biologically important ions (salts and minerals), small organic molecules and large macromolecules (primarily proteins). Hair testing is rarely performed in a clinical setting but may be ordered when an evaluation of longer-term tobacco use is desired. What does the test result mean? Nicotine and/or cotinine results may be reported as positive or negative, or as a level (e.g., nanograms per milliliter or ng/mL).
